Main Scriptures: Ezra, chapters 1, 2



Seventy years have passed since the people of Israel were taken captives to Babylon. God had already told about this captivity seventy years ago through Jeremiah.

"I, the Lord say to you. After seventy years in Babylon I will bring you back from captivity to the land of Israel."

This promise of God was fulfilled. After seventy years of Israel's captivity in Babylon, Cyrus, the king of Persia made a proclamation throughout his realm which freed the people of Israel to go back to their own land:

"The God of Israel is the only God. Anyone of His people among you, let him go up to Jerusalem in Judah and build the temple of the LORD."

King Cyrus also told to his people.

"And the people of any place where survivors may now be living are to provide him with silver and gold, with goods and livestock, and with freewill offerings for the temple of God in Jerusalem."

The Israelites who heard the word of King Cyrus prepared to go back to Jerusalem. The


Right, Chris. God chastises those who do wrong but He forgives and loves them if they turn back from their sin,

Her hymns includes 'Jesus Shed His Blood for Me' (144), 'Blessed Assurance, Jesus is Mine' (204), 'All the Way My Saviour Leads Me' (434), and many others.

A pastor once expressed that he wished Crosby wasn't blind.

"If I could be born again I want to born blind. When I open my eyes in heaven I will see Jesus in my first sight. What an indescribable joy it will be." Miss Crosby replied.

She wrote the following song when she was eighteen years old.
