Genesis 4:1-15



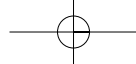
Adam had two sons named Cain and Abel.

Cain and Abel grew up hearing about God from their parents, Adam and Eve.

Among these stories was how Adam and Eve sinned and were kicked out of the Garden of Eden, and about how God made garments of skin to clothe them of their nakedness.

The older brother, Cain, was a farmer, and Abel, the younger brother, was a shepherd.

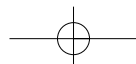
One day, the two brothers came together to offer sacrifices to God.



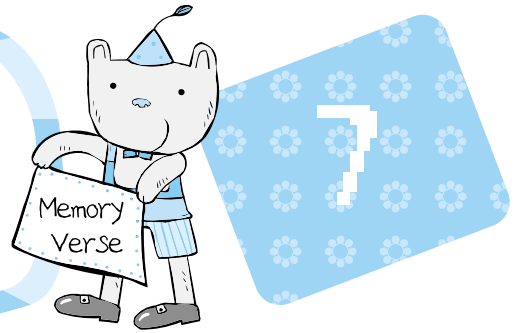
Cain offered God the produce of his hard labor while Abel in faith offered up the firstling of a lamb.
God rejected Cain's offering while receiving Abel's offering.
Because of this, hatred grew in Cain's heart towards his brother Abel.



GOD: "Why do you have hatred in your heart? Beware that sin is crouching at the door and do not sin."



In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace. (Ephesians 1:7)



But after some time, while Cain and Abel were out together in the field, Cain rose up against Abel and killed him.

GOD: "Cain, Where is Abel your brother?"

CAIN: "I do not know. Am I my brother's keeper?"

GOD: "What have you done? The voice of your brother's blood cries out to Me from the ground. So now you are cursed from the earth and you shall be a fugitive and a vagabond on the earth."

Cain was cursed and punished according to what God said.
