

### Isaac, Who Endured

Bible Passages: Genesis 26:1-33



God blessed Isaac and he became very prosperous; he had a great number of crops, flocks, herds and servants. Now, the Philistines envied Isaac and stopped up all the wells with dirt, which his father Abraham's servants had dug in the days of Abraham. The Philistine King, Abimelech, said to Isaac,

"Get away from us, for you are much stronger than us."

Without saying a word, Isaac departed and pitched his tent in the Valley of Gerar. There, Isaac dug water wells again. When the herdsmen of Gerar began to quarrel with Isaac's herdsmen, he picked up his stuff and moved to another place and dug another well there. And he would keep on moving around and digging wells in new places, looking for a place where no one would quarrel with him. And wherever he went, God always provided him with water through his wells.

Then Isaac went up to Beersheba and the Lord appeared to him and said,

# If it is possible, as much as depends on you, live peaceably with all men. (Romans 12:18)



"I am the God of your father Abraham. Do not fear, for I am with you. I will bless you and multiply your descendants, for My servant Abraham's sake."

So Isaac built an altar there and worshipped God. Isaac's servants also dug a well there.

Then Abimelech came to see Isaac with Ahuzzath, his friend, and Phichol, the commander of his army, from Gerar. They said,

"We have certainly seen that the Lord is with you. Let there now be an oath between us, between you and us; and let us make a covenant with you, that you will do us no harm, since we have not touched you, and since we have done nothing to you but good and have sent you away in peace. You are now the blessed of the Lord."

So Isaac made them a feast, and they are and drank. Then they arose early in the morning and swore an oath of peace with one another.

#### Precious Well

Isaac lived a nomadic life and traveled with herds and flocks following grass and water just like his father Abraham. Wells are dug up in a place where a stream of water is found underground. The wells were precious enough for Isaac to name each one of them.

The Land of Canaan was very dry and had insufficient rain, meaning having a well was considered almost as important as having life. The Philistines filling the precious wells with soil was similar to inviting Isaac to war. However, Isaac, who was gentle, conceded the well to the Philistines as a believer of God. As a result, he manifested God to the people who did not know about Him.
