and worshiped the LORD.



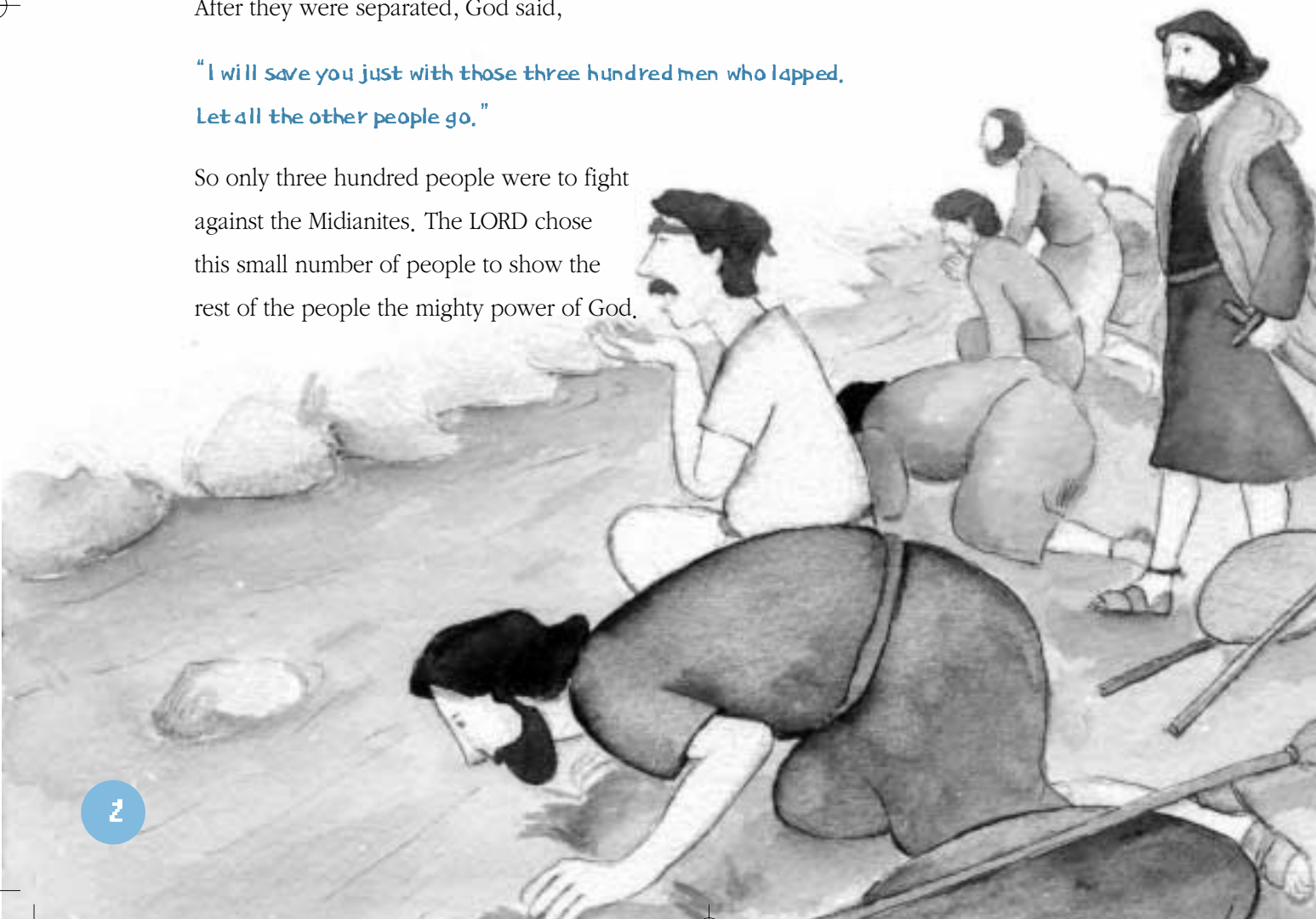

So God told those who were afraid to return. Then 10,000 were left. But this was still too much for the LORD.

"Bring them down to the water and I will test them there. Those who drink the water by lapping it like dogs shall be separated from those who drink the water by getting on their knees."

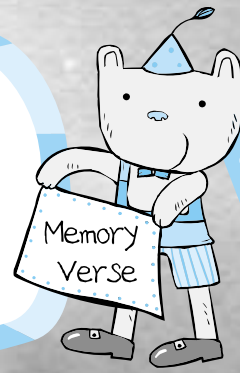
After they were separated, God said,

"I will save you just with those three hundred men who lapped. Let all the other people go."

So only three hundred people were to fight against the Midianites. The LORD chose this small number of people to show the rest of the people the mighty power of God.

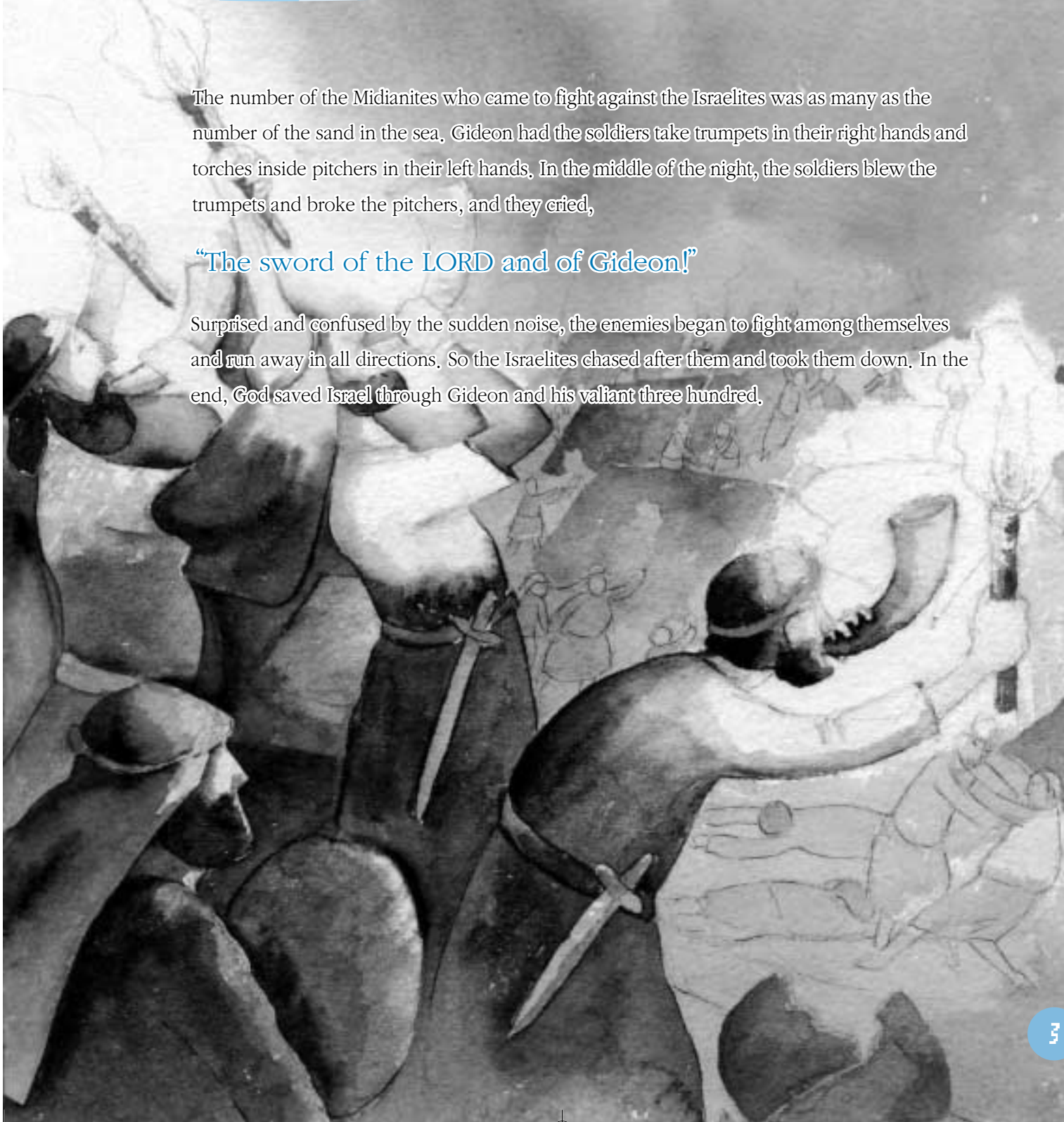


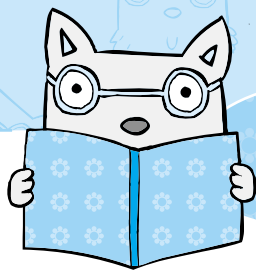

Gideon had the soldiers take trumpets in their right hands and torches inside pitchers in their left hands. In the middle of the night, the soldiers blew the trumpets and broke the pitchers, and they cried,

“The sword of the LORD and of Gideon!”

Surprised and confused by the sudden noise, the enemies began to fight among themselves and run away in all directions. So the Israelites chased after them and took them down. In the end, God saved Israel through Gideon and his valiant three hundred.

How did the three hundred Israelites defeat the large number of Midianites?

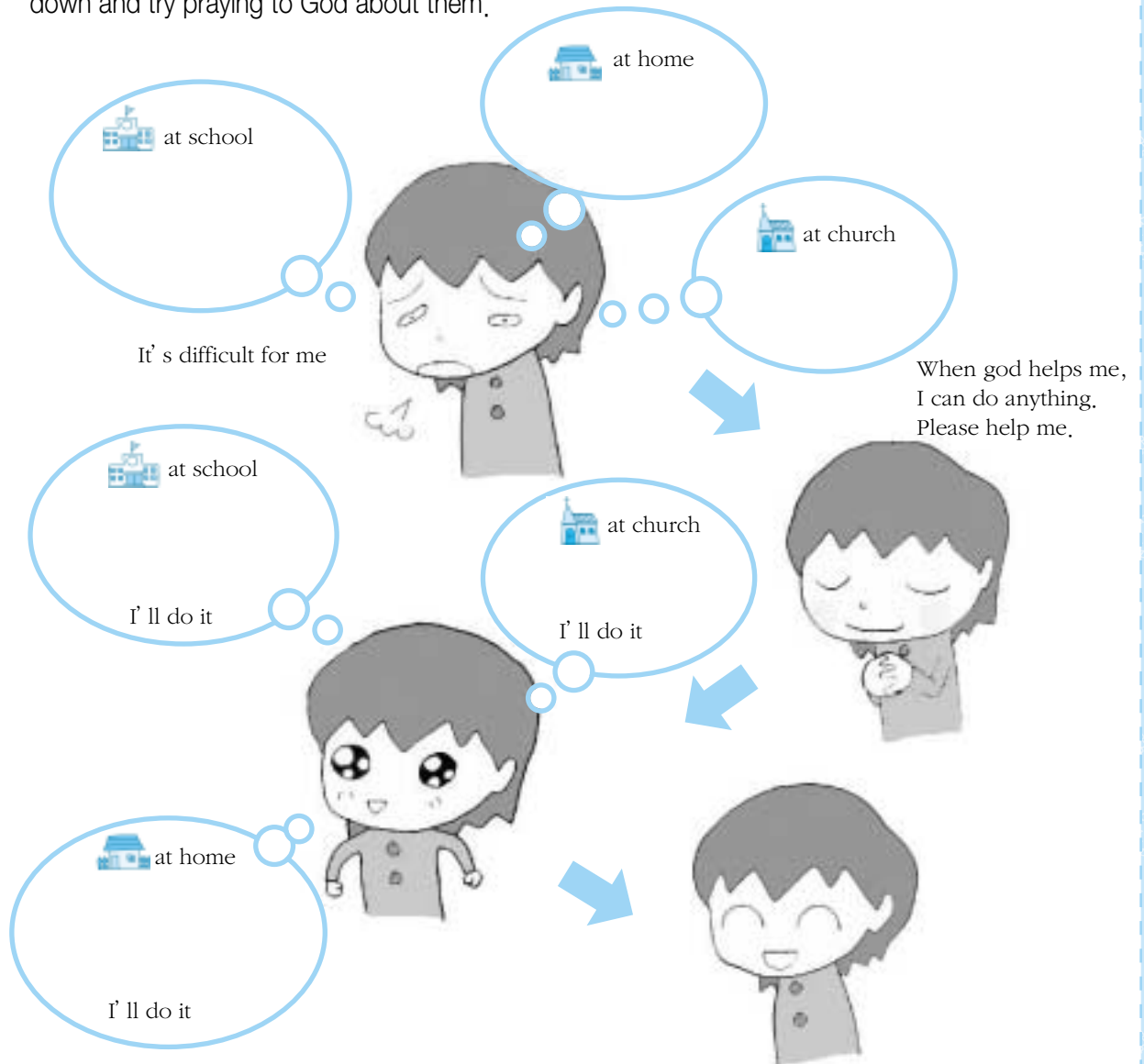
"Then all this assembly shall know that the LORD does not save with sword and spear; for the battle is the LORD's, and He will give you into our hands." (1 Samuel 17:47)

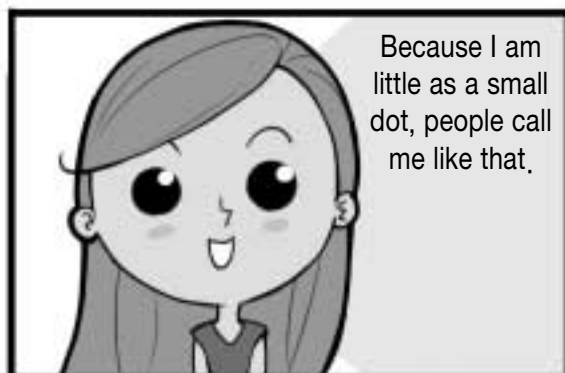

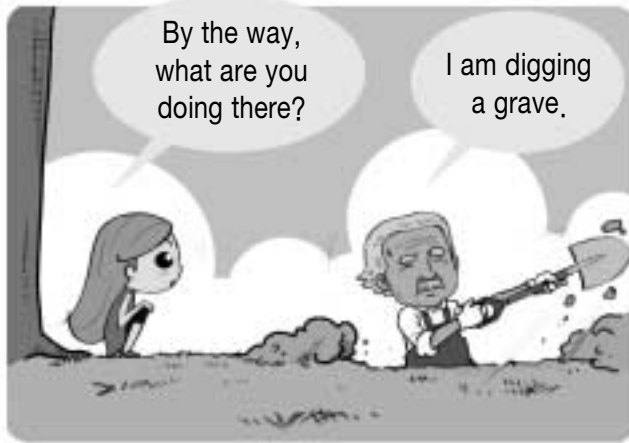
