Acts 16:1-3, 1 Timothy 1:1-20,
2 Timothy 1:1-18



When I call to remembrance the genuine faith that is in you, which dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice, and I am persuaded is in you also. (2 Timothy 1:5)

And that from childhood you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus. For all seek their own, not the things which are of Christ Jesus. But you know his proven character, that as a son with his father he served with me in the gospel. (Philippians 2:21-22)

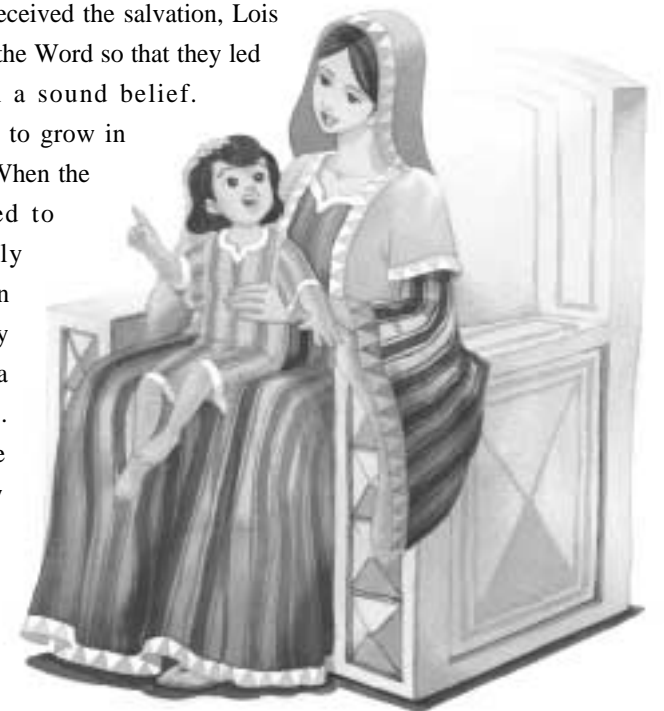
Timothy was a faithful disciple and a companion of Paul. He was born in Lystra of Lycaonia and he was born between a Greek father and a Jewish mother. Timothy became Christian when Apostle Paul first visited Lystra. Timothy's grandmother, Lois, and his mother, Eunice, were Jewish Christians and their lives had a great impact on the faith of Timothy. Timothy learned the Bible from his mother since childhood and even as a young man, he received praises from those around him for his faith. Apostle Paul especially loved him and Paul even called him a true son in faith. During Paul's second journey, Timothy accompanied him and when others sought after their own gain and not of Christ's, Timothy endured with Paul to witness the Gospel.

The foundation behind Timothy's character as a faithful worker of God and a dependable companion of Paul was built upon the teachings from his grandmother, Lois, and his mother, Eunice, since his childhood.

Even before Timothy received the salvation, Lois and Eunice taught him the Word so that they led him to develop with a sound belief.

Therefore he was able to grow in faith without fallacy. When the

Gospel was conveyed to him, he immediately received the salvation and received many praises from others as a great man of faith. Through Timothy, we can truly learn how important it is to grow in the Word as a child to become a faithful worker of God.
