The woman said to Him, "Sir, I perceive that You are a prophet. Our fathers worshiped on this mountain, and you Jews say that in Jerusalem is the place where one ought to worship." Jesus said to her, "Woman, believe Me, the hour is coming when you will neither on this mountain, nor in Jerusalem, worship _____. You worship what you do not know; we know what we worship, for salvation is of the Jews. But the hour is coming, and now is when the true worshipers will worship the Father in _____ and _____; for the Father is seeking such to worship Him. God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth." (John 4:19-24)

People who attend church are familiar with words related to worship service. The Samaritan woman was the same. Today, the situation has not changed very much. Many so called churchgoers regard God as an idol and they build big church buildings, in which they assume God stays. Therefore during the week they live their lives in any way that pleases them and pretend to be worshipping God righteously on Sundays. And as soon as they leave the church building, they continue their life of sin.



"Am I a god near at hand," says the Lord, "And not a God far off? Can anyone hide himself in secret places, so I shall not see him?" says the Lord; "Do I not fill heaven and earth?" says the Lord (Jeremiah 23:23-24)

As described above, worship does not require a certain, designated place. Worship should not occur only at certain times. Certain order or tradition is not what is important, because God is spiritual. Worship can only be done spiritually and with the truth of the Word. In other words, worship is the obedient life of a born again Christians in itself.

We can give portions of our possessions as an offering, or we can give a portion of our time for the work of God. However the Bible tells us to give our whole body to Him.

I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. (Romans 12:1)

Sacrificing our whole being is the worship that pleases the Lord.
