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Jacob who was led by God

Genesis 28-32, Isaiah 12:2



Behold, I am with you and will keep you wherever you go, and will bring you back to this land; for I will not leave you until I have done what I have spoken to you. (Genesis 28:15)

Behold, God is my salvation, I will trust and not be afraid; 'For YAH, the LORD, is my strength and song; He also has become my salvation (Isaiah 12:2)

Jacob is a grandson of Abraham and a son of Isaac. God knew that His plan will be fulfilled not through Isaac but Jacob. Throughout Jacob's life, there were several turning points in his spiritual walk. First, he was born, holding unto his brother Esau's heel and ran away after he received the blessing of the firstborn. On his way to his uncle Laban, God appeared to him and blessed him. Through this event, he knew that God was with him. Up until this point, Jacob was a selfish, cunning, and crafty person. But secondly, Jacob was deceived by his own uncle Laban and worked for him for twenty years.

If it were old Jacob, he would have left Laban long ago, but he waited for God's answer six more years. Third, on his way to the 'Eland of his fathers' (Canaan) he meets God and wrestles with Him at the ford of Jabbok. He acknowledged God's protection and love toward him and came to trust in God even more. For the rest of his life, he submitted to God completely and trusted in Him in everything he did.

03. Jacob was still unchanged, relying on his own knowledge. What happened as he stayed up all night, fearing for what is to come, at the ford of Jabbok? (Genesis 32:24)



04. Jacob changed into a God-fearing man. Let's share an experience in which you only relied on God. 1. Let's find the meaning of the names 'Esau' and 'Jacob'. (Genesis 25:25, 26, 30)
